Education is Sophia's passion and she is super excited to be a part of the Manitou Springs


Jenny Romano, Special Education Teacher

Do you remember hearing, "When are we going to use this in the real world?" when you were in high school? That relevance is central to career and college readiness discussions at MSHS.

Last spring, MSHS expanded its health science career pathway, adding two teachers and several new classes.

At its base is the athletic training program lead by Nick Nunley. With over 200 students participating in athletics, it's a natural hook to get students thinking about the number one employment field in Colorado - health care. The courses include aspects from science and math, as well as public health issues. His guest speakers range from physical therapists and public health officials to nurses and doctors.

Students become aware of careers that require a certification, to a bachelor's degree and beyond what it takes to get those jobs.
